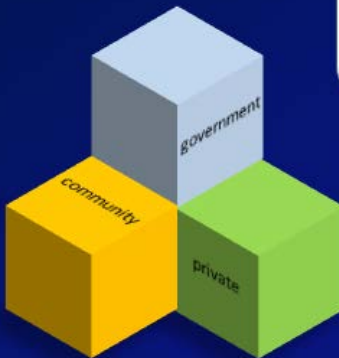

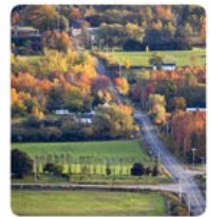

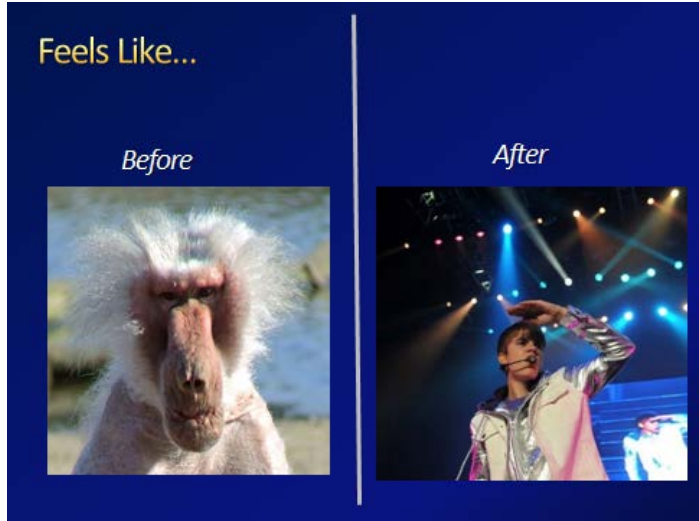
June's Profile is the [Community Links - Seniors and Gambling](#). This past year, one of Community Link's projects focused on Seniors and Gambling. An initial research report completed in 2009 funded by Gambling Awareness Nova Scotia led to an idea that gambling among seniors might be "a hidden problem".
